Vacancies: Postgraduate Medical Training & University Teaching Hospitals

The Ministry of Health and Sanitation (MoHS) of the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone has the overall responsibility of providing leadership and coordination of health services in the country. In fulfilling that mandate, the MoHS constantly develop policies and implements programmes and interventions aimed at providing safe healthcare services to patients at an affordable cost and in the most efficient manner.

Consistent with the above, the government of Sierra Leone established the College of Medicine and Allied Health Sciences (COMAHS) in 1989 to train medical practitioners who will provide safe and high quality healthcare services to the people of Sierra Leone. To date, it remains the only Medical School in the country. While the institution has been indispensable in the overall delivery of healthcare in the country, it has never attained the status of training specialized medical doctors and currently, all doctors trained at COMAHS have to seek specialized training from other countries in the sub-region or elsewhere. The practice of sending doctors for specialized training in other countries is both expensive and does not always produce the desired number of specialists since many doctors fail to return home after completion of training. Consequently, the number of specialists in the country has constantly remained low and therefore inadequate to meet the needs of the country.

This unfortunate situation was exacerbated by the outbreak of the Ebola virus disease when many doctors died within a short period of time, leaving an already understaffed health system struggling to cope during an emergency of global proportions. To address this situation the Government of Sierra Leone through the Ministry of Health and Sanitation is embarking on establishing a local Post Graduate Medical Training Programme as one of its flagship programmes to increase the supply of specialist doctors in the country. This will be established by the enactment of the Teaching Hospital Complex Administration Act 2016 and the Sierra Leone Council of Postgraduate Colleges of Health Specialist Act 2016.

MOHS is seeking to fill the following positions for the Postgraduate Medical Training and University Teaching Hospitals, to be located at the various hospitals in Freetown.

I. Chief Medical Director: University Teaching Hospitals

The University Teaching Hospitals are located in Freetown with approximately 10,000 admissions per year. The hospitals provide medical care for adults and children from the western Area and also serves as the only tertiary referral hospital for the country. The hospitals are seeking accreditation by the West African colleges in Paediatrics, Internal Medicine and Obstetrics and Gynaecology. As the

Chief Medical Director you would have a direct and significant impact on the quality of care provided at the Hospital and play a crucial role in the development of Sierra Leones first ever postgraduate training programme, producing the country's future leaders in Health. Under the Strategic direction of the Teaching Hospital Board, the Chief Medical Director will be responsible for the effective and smooth running of the Teaching Hospitals and also ensure the occurrence of postgraduate training in all the Hospitals.

KEY AREAS OF ACCOUNTABILITY:

- Accreditation for postgraduate medical training of any remaining departments for Post graduate Specialist training
- The Chief Medical Director shall be responsible for the execution of the policies and matters affecting the day-to-day management of the Administration.
- Improvement in hospital's performance and efficiency within the allocated budget and
- advice on strategic staff hiring and professional development to the hospital management team.

2. Deputy Chief Medical Director: University Teaching Hospitals

ROLE SPECIFICATION:

Under the Strategic direction of the Chief Medical Director, The DCMD (CMAC) will ensure a high academic and Clinical standard at the teaching hospitals. The DCMD will supervise the Clinical Deputy Directors to ensure a high standard of care is given within the University Teaching Hospitals. The DCMD will communicate gaps and Lapses in protocol management with the CMD for immediate correction. The DCMD will also assist the CMD in identifying academic staff requirements for the optimal running of the Teaching Hospitals.

3 Consultant Histopathologist

The Connaught Hospital is located in the Central part of Freetown with approximately 5,000 admissions per year. The Hospital provides medical care for Adults from the western Area and also serves as the only Tertiary referral Hospital for the country. As a Consultant Physician in Internal Medicine, You would have a direct and significant impact on the quality of care provided at the Hospital and play a crucial role in the development of Sierra Leones first ever postgraduate training programme, producing the country's future leaders in Internal Medicine

ROLE SPECIFICATION:

To ensure that the Histopathological services provided at Connaught Hospital is at a level expected of a centre of clinical excellence and that a high quality postgraduate training programme is delivered. This is an opportunity to take a leadership role in establishing the first Histopathology postgraduate training program in Sierra Leone.

4. Consultant Oncologist

The Connaught Hospital is located in the Central part of Freetown with approximately 5,000 admissions per year. The Hospital provides medical care for Adults from the western Area and also serves as the only Tertiary referral Hospital for the country. As a Consultant Oncologist you will have an office at Connaught Hospital but you will

be expected to give clinical services to PCMH (Princess Christian Maternity Hospital) and ODCH (Ola During Childrens Hospital).

7. Consultant Paediatrician

The Ola during Children's Hospital is located in the Eastern part of Freetown with approximately 10,000 admissions per year. The

Hospital provides medical care for neonates and Children from the Eastern Area but also serves as the only Tertiary referral Centre for Paediatrics for the country.

ODCH is one of the hospitals in the Teaching Hospital Complex Administration. The Teaching Hospital Complex Administration Act is passed and has received Presidential Assent. The Sierra Leone Council for Postgraduate Colleges of Health Specialist Act has also been passed paving the way for Local Postgraduate training in Sierra Leone to commence. As a short term goal, accreditation from the West African College of Physicians is being sought. Postgraduate training will start under the West African College of Physician.
